# "The Paschal Mystery"

Every year when we come to Holy Week, the Church celebrates the passion, death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is this historic week when Jesus entered Jerusalem for the Jewish holy days of Passover (pesah-passover, and the root of paschal), and then is crucified, buried and rises again on Easter.

This week changed history as we know it, and billions of people will join with us in celebrating the mystery of our salvation in Christ's once and for all death and resurrection. It is such an important week in the life of the Church that it cannot be contained in one Sunday, and the power of Easter is so magnificent, that we celebrate for an entire season of 50 days (from Easter Sunday to Pentecost).

This year we will celebrate the entire salvation drama with these services/ opportunities:

- Palm Sunday (April 14) one service at 10:45 a.m.
- Maundy Thursday (April 18) evening service at 7:00 p.m. (celebrating Holy Communion)
- Good Friday (April 19) evening service at 8:00 p.m. (Service of Tenebrae)
- Easter Vigil (April-19-21) a time of waiting and prayer
- Early Easter Service (April 21) at 7:30 a.m. (Though technically, it will not be at sunrise, we will celebrate the women coming to the grave early in the morning in the cemetery.)
- Easter Breakfast—8:30-10:00 a.m.
- Easter Service—10:15 a.m. in Sanctuary (a full celebration of Easter full of music, proclamation, and response)

## The Easter "Season"

Many think that Easter is just one Sunday of the year, and that things go back to normal after April 21. Well, think again. We will celebrate Easter for the entire "Great 50 Days." Preaching and worship will celebrate Resurrection themes from Easter Sunday until Pentecost (June 9). It is a great season for baptisms and the renewal of baptismal vows. (If there is anyone wishing to be baptized, please let the pastor know.) It is a season of joy and celebration so you will notice it throughout worship and responses. Prepare yourselves for an Easter to remember!
